Submit application to membership chairperson. Application is voted upon the Board of Directors at the next scheduled Board Meeting.

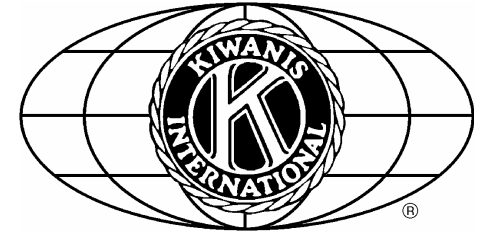
After Boards approval, the new member receives a dignified ceremony at which the new member receives their "K" pin, Certificate of Membership, club directory and printed materials from Kiwanis.
